A Message from Mayor Giunta

Dear Residents,

Manorhaven has seen a lot of activity this past month. It began on 9/11 with a stirring 9/11 Commemorative Ceremony, dedicating our new 9/11 garden walkway and bench. On 9/23, the first Manorhaven Family Fun Festival at the Preserve was a fun-filled revival of community spirit. Our Village Food Drive is also taking place this month. Village Hall has even started a makeover of the Village interior. We are especially proud of our Manorhaven entry rug with the Village Emblem and hope you will stop by to see it! There have been other updates, projects and positive changes to our Village at large that I would like to report to you:

- Work has begun on the #3 pump at the pump station to rectify its improper installation 3 years ago. This repair will dramatically increase the efficiency of our pump station;
- Road equipment sanders have been repaired in anticipation of winter storms;
- The licensing fees for landscapers, electricians & plumbers have been revamped;
- A committee has been formed to review all existing Village Codes;
- We have responded to and repaired 2 emergency sewer blockages, cleaned 14 catch basins, continued regular maintenance of other catch basins within the Village and had 13 street lights replaced;
- Installed a new crosswalk at Orchard Beach Blvd. due to safety hazards;
- Consulted with engineers to advise on the replacement of the force main;
- Continued work on the Rain Garden Project;
- Met with Councilwoman DeGiorgio and the Water Committee to move forward on the Morgan's Dock Project;
- Installed a new stop sign southbound on Ashwood Rd. where it meets with the cross street of Ford Place;
- Repaired, refinished, and painted some of the interior portions of Village Hall;
- Participated in the clean up of Manorhaven Beach with our local Girl Scouts;

It has only been three months, but our residents, volunteers, staff, Board of Trustees and I have been working hard to revitalize our beautiful Village. I want to thank you all and want you to know that we have more positive changes ahead!

STATE AUDIT UPDATES

In our last newsletter, we made our residents aware of the unfavorable state audit of our Village from 6/1/09 through 10/31/10. At the Village Hall Board Meeting on August 23, our newly hired forensic Certified Public Accounting Firm of Rosen & Federico gave the Village a detailed report of the former highly mismanaged financial practices they uncovered, and discussed the steps they now have in place to rectify them. We have further put in place, safeguards in the form of two resolutions passed by the Mayor and the Board for new procurement and credit card practices in the spirit of transparency and accountability. Our government is dedicated to being the best financial stewards that we can be.

FROM THE DESK OF PATRICK ABRAMSKI...

As Superintendent of Buildings, I'd like to report and comment on a few of the projects that are currently in progress within the Building Department of our Village:

WATER MAIN PROJECT IN MANHASSET ISLE:

I have been in constant contact with the Superintendent of the Port Washington Water District, Tal Vecchio, with regards to the ongoing water main project. Each week, a new work schedule is being posted online for our residents. Many residents have had questions regarding the steps that are involved in this process: 1. Initial phase: The roads are dug up and new water main piping is installed 2. Once initial digging and installation is completed, the digging locations are reopened. At that time, a new water main service line is installed to each home at no cost to the homeowner. Note: Any damage to the homeowner's lawn, curb blocks and/or property will be restored at no cost to the homeowner at the expense of the Water District. Such incidences should be reported to: *The Port Washington Water District* at 516-767-0171. 3. Once secondary pipes are completed, the water is sterilized, pressure tested and water samples are sent to the lab for testing and final approval by the Department of Health BEFORE the new lines will be used. Up until that point, old water lines will be used, so the water is SAFE to drink. 4. Estimated completion date is: Spring 2013.

MANORHAVEN BLVD. RAIN GARDEN PROJECT:

At the time of this publication, there are still some minor punch list items that need to be completed with regard to the brick pavers, as well as additional mulching and plantings. The project as it stands is approximately 99.5% complete.

ACTIVE BUILDING PERMITS:

There are currently 66 active building permits within the Village which are at various stages of construction. They are as follows: 17 large building permits, including new one and two-family houses and commercial properties; 22 small building permits, which consist of fences, new and refurbished driveways, sheds and paver projects; 8 sign permits; 3 solar panel projects; 3 sidewalk permits; 2 covered porches; 10 interior renovations and 1 soil boring permit. Due to code violations, one project recently received a stop work order.

GREASE TRAP PROGRAM:

In an effort to maintain the integrity of our sewers, the Building Department will do monthly inspections of food establishments in our Village in an attempt to monitor the excessive amounts of liquid wastes containing grease, oil and sand that have been causing damage to our already fragile sewer system. We will be checking the maintenance records of all grease interceptors in the Village and will also be checking all food establishments to determine if they have been operating without a grease interceptor device, which is required by Code.

HONORING OUR RESIDENTS

This month we would like to honor one of our youngest residents, ten year old, Courtney Burke. If there were an award for "Sister of the Year," Courtney would win, hands down. Courtney is the oldest of three girls. Abigail is eight, and Jessica is five. Abigail was diagnosed as an infant with pediatric neurotransmitter disease, a disease leaving her permanently disabled, unable to walk or talk. Abigail (Abby) recently underwent hip surgery as well. Abby is a happy little girl, whose joy is conveyed by her angelic smile. Abby's smile truly lights up a room, as her sisters Courtney and Jessica interact with and entertain her. Our featured resident, Courtney, has played a big part in keeping her sister Abby comfortable and happy. Before school each day, Courtney helps prepare Abby's breakfast and gets her ready for school. She also helps her mother, Louise Burke push her assistive chair to the waiting school bus. Abby attends Carmen Road School on Long Island; an amazing school where Abby has recently learned how to move a switch to indicate if she is hungry. On weekends, Courtney makes a comfortable place for Abby to watch her favorite interactive T.V. shows. Although Abby is unable to speak, Courtney seems to always know what she needs. Courtney sings 'Mona Lisa,' Abby's favorite song, to make her smile. Louise Burke described her oldest daughter as "an old soul," and Courtney's patience, kindness and caring are beyond her ten years. When asked about school, Courtney volunteers and is asked by her teacher to sit next to new students to help them get acclimated – Another testament to her competent, caring nature! Courtney's hobby is art. Louise said she fills every spare paper with her drawings, among those are portraits of Abby. While Abby has dedicated and supportive therapists, teachers, and nurses, her loving family has given her a special spark in her eyes. For a ten year old little girl, Courtney plays a big part in keeping her sister Abby smiling. Courtney put a smile in all our hearts as well!

ADDRESSING VILLAGE HALL'S STATE OF DISREPAIR AND NEGLECT

The Village Hall is the symbolic home of all our residents. Sadly, for a number of years, it has been allowed to fall into dangerous and unsightly disrepair through neglect. This has caused hazardous conditions in some cases. The main office area has unhealthy mold behind many of its walls resulting from leaks in our roofing, the building has loose bricks and mortar needing repair, eight window lintels and the chimney are in need of repair, the leaders and gutters need replacement, the office lighting is inadequate, and carpentry work was begun but left unfinished. We have begun much of the work that is necessary to address the upkeep, repair, and maintenance of these issues and concerns at Village Hall. Mayor Giunta has requested that Senator Martins redirect unused grant money by the previous administration to apply to new repairs. Multiple bids were received for the following completed renovations: painting the entrance hall, bathrooms and board room; replacement of stained and damaged ceiling tiles in the main entrance; painting and repair of the front entry door and glass; painting and re-sanding of the outdoor handrails; replacement of damaged flooring with new flooring in the entrance and kitchen, the stripping, re-staining and varnishing of the judicial bench, and the addition of a new entrance mat with our corporate seal. While additional items still need to be addressed, we will be sure to keep residents informed of all upcoming projects. The Village Hall represents and serves Manorhaven and belongs to all our residents. We are proud of our Village and its Village Hall and will make sure it is once again the "Pearl of Manhasset Bay."
