RESOLUTION NO. 33 - APRIL 23, 2009 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SUBDIVISION OF CERTAIN TAX LOTS AND CONFIRMING THE LEGALITY OF CERTAIN USES

Trustee Fahey offered the following resolution, seconded by Trustee DiLucia:

WHEREAS, Ressa Familly, LLC (the "Applicant") has previously submitted to the Inc. Village of Manorhaven (the "Village") an application to construct an eight-unit residential apartment complex at premises known as 50-52 Sintsink Drive East within the Village (the "premises"); and

WHEREAS, said premises are described on the Nassau County Land and Tax Map as Section 4, Block L, Lots 501-505 inclusive, and 770 and 776; and

WHEREAS, the applicant proposed to make certain adjustments to the lot lines of the premises by incorporating as part of the premises certain property adjoining to the north and south of the premises; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has filed with the Village a survey dated August 27, 2007 and revised April 17, 2008, which shows the proposed new lot lines of the premises (Exhibit "A"); and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has filed with the Village a legal description of that part of tax lot 789 which formerly comprised a part of 54 Sintsink Drive East within the Village, and which is now being incorporated as part of the premises (Exhibit "B"); and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has filed with the Village a legal description of those parts of tax lots 742 and 771 which formerly comprised a part of 44 Sintsink Drive East within the

Village, and which are being incorporated as part of the premises (Exhibit "C"); and

WHEREAS, the Nassau County Planning Commission has issued a non-jurisdictional letter dated March 10, 2009 in connection with this subdivision application; and

WHEREAS, the Village has previously approved the site plan of the applicant, reflecting the new lot lines as set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to formally approve the subdivision and the new lot lines of the premises and of the contiguous premises to the north and south of the premises (the "contiguous properties") and to confirm the legality of the continued use of the contiguous properties for those uses previously authorized by the Village;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village authorizes the subdivision of tax lots 789 and 742 and 771 in accordance with said Exhibit "A", and the incorporation of those parts of said tax lots as described in Exhibit "B" and Exhibit "C" into the premises; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the uses of the contiguous parcel to the north of the premises (54 Sintsink Drive East) and the contiguous parcel to the south of the premises (44 Sintsink Drive East), which premises after the subdivision authorized herein are described in Exhibit "D" and Exhibit "E" filed with the Village, be and hereby are and shall remain, unaffected by the subdivision authorized herein and said contiguous parcels as reduced by this subdivision are and shall remain legal for the uses previously authorized by the Village; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the provisions of this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
