Our goals during this reporting period included providing more opportunities for public participation in our stormwater program such as a local Earth Day event held on 4/24/10. We held a public meeting to discuss our annual MS4 report and take comments. We also made a commitment to continue our membership in the Manhasset Bay Protection Committee. which helps to raise public awareness of storm water conveyed pollutants, trash and floatable debris via annual beach clean up.

Lower amount of debris on beaches. (Please see attached sheet for more detailed information.)

B. Briefly summarize the observations that indicated the overall effectiveness of this Measurable Goal.

MBPC has participated in an Ocean Conservancy International beach clean up since 1998. Level of volunteers has remained steady, (50-70 per event) but poundage of trash has dropped. In 1998, 3500 pounds were removed including abandoned oil tanks, boats etc. The largest number of items are cigarette butts, styrofoam pieces, and food wrappers. Typical clean ups are now less than 100 pounds of stormwater conveyed debris, and a few heavy items, for 300-500 pounds. (see attached table.)

Conduct public meetings for members of the public and stakeholders at critical junctures on major projects, develop and maintain e-mailing and postal mailing lists to keep the public appraised and involved in projects undertaken by the COMMITTEE, assist in beach cleanups and wetland plantings to the extent possible, conduct attitude and awareness surveys, maintain and foster interrelationships with community organizations, business organizations, recreation organizations, educational institutions, environmental organizations and various levels of government.
