



GARBAGE & RECYCLING SCHEDULES

Working together to keep our village beautiful.



GARBAGE COLLECTION TIMES

Collection begins at 6:00 a.m. on the scheduled pick-up days. Please place trash receptacles on curbs any time **after 5:00 p.m.** the day before a pick-up.

Trash receptacles must be put away by **12:00 Midnight** on the day of your scheduled pick up. Loose plastic garbage bags of trash left outside of containers **WILL NOT** be picked up.

FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE TIMES AND PROCEDURES WILL RESULT IN A TICKET.



NUMBER OF TRASH CONTAINERS PER HOUSEHOLD UNIT

One Family Home: Up to **3** trash receptacles.

Two Family Home: Up to **3** trash receptacles per unit.



ACCEPTABLE BINS FOR GARBAGE

Bins size up to **32 gallons**.

Bins over 32 gallons **will not be collected**.

All bins must be watertight, metal or plastic containers **WITH a lid**.



BULK PICK-UPS

All large items MUST BE called into Meadow Carting for a pick-up date (normally Thursday and Friday).



DUMPSTERS

Residents must apply to the Village Building Department for a permit.



RECYCLABLES

Recyclables of glass, metal, and plastic # 1 AND 2 ONLY should be placed at the curb in recycle bins with lids on regular pick-up days. Recycle bins may be purchased at Village Hall for \$25. Recycle bins or cans should be **blue in color**. Bundled paper should be placed next to recycle bins. **CARDBOARD SHOULD BE FLATTENED AND BUNDLED TO AVOID A TICKET.**



ELECTRONIC ITEMS

No electronics may be disposed of with regular garbage on ANY pick-up day. No televisions, microwaves, stereos, computers, printers, etc.

S.T.O.P. (Stop Throwing Out Pollutants) Events are held by the Town of North Hempstead throughout the year to dispose of electronics and a full schedule was mailed to residents and included in our Winter Newsletter.



YARD WASTE

Yard waste collection is **every Wednesday** (excluding holidays) from the **first Wednesday in April** through the **last Wednesday in December**.

For Loose Grass or Leaves: Containers, paper bags, or plastic bags are now accepted with yard waste. To avoid getting a ticket, use **three containers max or six bags, max**. Sticks, twigs and branches must be **tied into manageable bundles**.

CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL AND HAZARDOUS WASTE IS NOT PERMITTED!

(paint, chemicals, toilets, sinks, motor oil, car batteries, tires, etc.)

Christmas trees may only be placed at the curb the **first two Wednesdays in January**.

MONDAY AND THURSDAY

All of Manhasset Isle, including: Tom's Point; Manorhaven Blvd. including businesses and apartments from Sands Point Road to Firwood; Ashwood through Edgewood Road including Sands Point Road and Cambridge Avenue from Sands Point to Firwood and Ford Place; South Orchard Beach area including Linwood South; Marwood South; Kaywood; Norwood South; Oldwood South; West Drive; Arcadia; and Orchard Beach Blvd.



TUESDAY AND FRIDAY

Firwood through Kirkwood, including: Cambridge Avenue from Firwood through Kirkwood; Linwood North; Marwood North; Cornwell's Lane; Dunes Lane; Cornwall; and Manorhaven Blvd. including businesses and apartments from Firwood to Oldwood



HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

No pick-up on the following days:

- **New Year's Day**
- **President's Day**
- **Memorial Day**
- **Independence Day**
- **Labor Day**
- **Columbus Day**
- **Thanksgiving**
- **Christmas**

On legal holidays, trash will be picked up the following day. Garbage cannot be placed at the curb earlier than 5:00 p.m. on the night before a pick-up day and must be put away by 12:00 Midnight the day of pick-up to avoid a ticket.

ITEM	HOW TO PREPARE FOR RECYCLING	WHAT IS <i>NOT</i> RECYCLABLE
GLASS	Includes beverage bottles and food jars • Empty and rinse all residue and place in your recycling bin. • Remove all caps or lids and discard in your regular garbage. • Labels do not need to be removed	• Lightbulbs*, window and auto glass, mirrors, dishes, drinking glasses, broken glass, pottery or clay pots. • Caps and lids.
METAL	Includes food and beverage cans, aluminum foil, baking tins and license plates. • Rinse all residue and place in your recycling bin. • Place up to one license plate in bin per week, blackout license numbers with black marker.	• Cans used for chemicals or paint, aerosol spray cans.** • Appliances, electronic waste (e-waste), batteries or tools.
PLASTIC	Includes plastic items containing food, beverages, laundry detergent, personal care products, cleaning supplies with the numbers 1 or 2 in the recycling triangle normally found imprinted on the bottom of the container. • Rinse all residue and flatten, then place in your recycling bin. • Empty contents and wash thoroughly.	• Bulk plastic such as toys or lawn furniture. • Styrofoam, foam egg cartons, foam packing peanuts, flexible frozen food meat trays, plastic grocery bags, six-pack holders (cut before discarding), plastic shower curtains, plastic containers used for motor oil, paint, corrosive chemicals, solvents and lawn care products.***
PAPER	Includes newspapers and inserts, magazines and catalogs, office and school paper, index cards, telephone books, paperback books, hardcover books with hardcovers removed, computer paper, discarded mail, paper grocery bags and paper lunch bags.	• Paper plates or paper cups, paper towels, non-paper envelopes.
CARDBOARD	Includes corrugated cardboard, clean pizza boxes, cereal boxes, pasta boxes without plastic windows or other food boxes (clean and with the plastic interior bag removed), and folders • Corrugated cardboard must be flattened and tied in bundles 2 ft.x2 ft. x 6in. and placed next to recycling bin.	• Cardboard with wax or Styrofoam, dirt, food grease or plastic.
SPECIAL NOTE	Please do NOT use garbage bags or plastic bags for recyclables. Electronic waste is not accepted at the curb, pursuant to NY State Law. *Lithium, rechargeable, button and car batteries and compact fluorescent bulbs (CLFs), appliances, electronic waste are collected 6 days a week at the following locations: Solid Waste Management Authority, 999 West Shore Rd., Roslyn **Aerosol spray cans are accepted for recycling at S.T.O.P. events only. ***Motor oil, paint, corrosive chemicals, solvents and lawn care products are accepted at S.T.O.P. events only.
